## Startup InvestingNote to promote financial literacy

INVESTING Note Pte Ltd, which provides free crowd-sourced information on retail investing through its social network site, hopes to establish itself as a platform through which remisiers can share their investing knowledge.

Its website, www.investingnote.com, aims to foster interaction among retail investors in Singapore and the region, and so raise their financial literacy. Information available there includes stock price estimates, company studies and research reports; users also have access to charting functions for technical analysis and market data from regional stock exchanges.

The founder and chief executive of Investing Note, Shanison Lin, said: "We are working with The Society of Remisiers Singapore to tap the knowledge and expertise of its trading-representative members, who may be interested in establishing their foothold in the social media space."

Investing Note Pte Ltd is an associ-

ate company of Singapore Press Holdings subsidiary ShareInvestor.

The website, supported by the National Research Foundation's micro-funding programme, i.JAM Reload, positions itself as a "new-generation online forum - designed for investors to exchange investment ideas and access financial insights and information".

The site, launched in August 2014, now has 4,500 registered users, including a pool of seasoned investors.

It has been evaluating them and awarding them user badges, which entitles them to make forecasts and share their knowledge; the site allocates them "reputation points" when they gain new followers, garner "likes" for their posts or have their posts shared by users.

The points system offers users a way to gauge these experts' credibility and quality of posts.

Signing up for an account is free; users can access the platform via its mobile app as well. The Android version of the app, InvestingNote, is available for download at the Google Play store; the iOS version of the app is due out next month.

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
